One Minute Tech ~ from your IT Guy, Mike Moore

Are you looking for ways to spruce up your home for the holidays and want to add a bit of techy flair? LED lighting is not new but there is a new type of light bulb you should check out. Phillips has produced an LED lightbulb that can be controlled via Bluetooth with any



smartphone. There is a free app available that lets you control each "HUE Smart Lightbulb" individually or as a group and some bulbs can be tuned to emit different colors of light and intensity. The app lets you program the HUE lightbulbs to shut off at specific times or gradually brighten on schedule to help you wake up in the morning. The HUE LED smart lightbulbs use 80% less electricity than traditional bulbs, and they come in a variety of shapes and sizes to fit any of your existing fixtures. Besides the free app which controls up to 10 HUE lightbulbs, a smart hub lets you control up to 50 HUE lightbulbs so there are limitless possibilities for lighting your home and adding special lighting for any event. They are available online or locally at Home Depot. White dimmable HUE's cost about \$25 each and color changing HUE's cost about \$50 each. Each bulb lasts 15,000 hours or just shy of 2 years if they were left on constantly. While not cheap, HUE smart lightbulbs will add an exciting new look to any home. Youth & Children's Ministry ~ Pastor Heather

As we have entered the Advent season, I want to encourage families to create an Advent wreath at home to light each week, if you have not already created an Advent tradition at home.. This can be a great way to help young ones mark this season of preparing and waiting (and a reminder this season is more than just for parents!)

We do have several At-Home Advent Wreaths available to pick up at the church, or your family can make your own! The picture below is done with playdough and birthday candles!

Each week when you light the candles, follow this ritual from Traci Smith:



Week 1: Light 1 purple candle for hope and ask, "What does it mean to have hope as we wait for Jesus' birth?

Week 2: Light 1 purple candle for hope and the pink for Love and ask, "What does it mean to have hope and love as we wait for Jesus' birth?

Week 3: Light 1 purple for hope, the pink, and 1 purple for Joy and ask, "what does it mean to have hope, love and joy as we wait for Jesus' birth?"

Week 4: Light 1 purple for hope, the pink, and 1 purple for Joy, and 1 for peace, and ask, "what does it mean to have hope, love, joy, and peace as we wait for Jesus' birth?"

Christmas Eve: Light all candles, including the center white candle and ask, "How do we experience hope, peace, joy, and the love of Jesus in our lives?" End by singing Silent Night together (or listen to the song if that is more comfortable to your family)

Christmas Special Offering 2020



crafting hope. Paths are not so much found as made.
Through your faithful contributions this year, The Christian
Church in the Southwest has been able to do significant ministry in 2020. We have offered a strong program of learning events around Evangelism, Disciples Identity, Practical Ministry, and
Theology. We conducted significant seminars around dismantling racism. We offered multiple resources to congregations navigating this pandemic. As the COVID-19 canceled much of our youth and children programming, the CCSW provided online youth programming in the form of CCSW Adventures with keynotes, activities, and mission opportunities for Children and Youth. CCSW youth engaged in the first ever online antiracism training for youth in October; Regional staff have become experts on providing pastoral care through telephone and teleconference calls. We even had a Regional Assembly!


